Forms of Bequest

(Remember that you should seek legal advice when making or altering a Will)

"I give and bequeath to the Provincial for the time being of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), Milltown Park, Dublin 6, the sum of for such charitable purposes connected with the work of the Society of Jesus as the Provincial may decide"

or

"I give and bequeath to the Provincial for the time being of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), Milltown Park, Dublin 6, the sum of, to be devoted by him for such legally charitable purposes as I have made known to him by non-testamentary instruction."

(In this case the Testator would need to inform Fr Provincial of a particular charitable objective in writing, by a separate signed note. This would be kept on file.)

Note: The Jesuits operate various Charitable Trusts in Ireland. The principal Trust for their apostolates overall is "Rathfarnham Charitable Trust of the Jesuit Fathers - CHY No. 3587".

The Irish Jesuits

Every year the Irish Jesuits benefit from the kind remembrance of friends of the Society who have gone home to God. A bequest is a wonderful gift, and a great way of expressing gratitude for graces received. It is a gift for the future, perhaps the distant future, a time known only to God. It is a gift that will be received with great gratitude, perhaps not by the current generation of Jesuits, but by those who will carry on their work, both Jesuit and lay.

The Jesuits conduct many different kinds of work in Ireland: preaching the word of God; spiritual direction and fostering prayer; teaching and giving pastoral care in schools; helping young adults to become Christian leaders;

assisting immigrants and refugees; working with the homeless; helping people to understand who God is through the teaching of theology; writing, lecturing, and broadcasting on important issues of faith and ethics.

A bequest can be made in favour of all the work carried out by the Jesuits in Ireland, or in favour of some particular activity. A bequest can be big or small. Generations of Jesuit novices have been reminded that their work is sustained 'by the pennies of the poor'. A bequest can include a request for remembrance in Masses or prayers.

In this leaflet there is a list of some of the works carried out in Ireland by the Jesuits.

Details are also given of ways of making bequests. If you are drawing up, or revising, a Will in the near future, perhaps you could give some thought to the work done by the Jesuits. A bequest will help us continue these apostolates into the future.
